## Dear Governor Murphy,

As leaders of the Garden State's major business associations, we wanted to inform you ahead of your upcoming budget address of the business community's top priorities for the FY22 state budget. As you know, 2020 was a devastating year for the business community. As we round out the FY21 budget year and start the FY22 process, we cannot afford additional tax and regulatory burdens. To that end, our main ask is for a budget that prioritizes stimulating our economy and avoids policies that will place any additional costs or burdens on our businesses.

We want to highlight some sobering statistics that we ask you to keep in mind as you go into your budget announcement. The number of small businesses open in New Jersey compared to pre-pandemic levels in January of 2020 is down 43.8%, and their revenue is down 43.9%. Consistently throughout the pandemic, New Jersey has had among the worst unemployment rates in the nation (7.6% today) and has seen more and more people drop completely out of the labor market. We need a budget that accounts for these difficult circumstances and does not exacerbate them.

History shows us that we have turned to increased taxes and spending in both good economic times and bad. We must break this cycle.

To do that, the FY22 budget must avoid both increasing taxes and non-priority spending. Last year, amid the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting economic crisis, New Jersey businesses and residents saw several tax increases enacted, new spending unrelated to the pandemic and borrowing at rates higher than any state in the nation just to balance the budget. One of the best ways to avoid the need for tax increases is to pursue structural reforms that will improve our fiscal health without cutting support for our state's vulnerable populations that depends on state assistance. The savings that would ensue from proper reforms would allow for necessary investments in our state without needing to rely on raising taxes further.

If revenues continue to be stronger than expected and/or New Jersey receives billions more in federal assistance, another way to improve our state's economic outlook is to focus expenditures in areas that will provide strong return on investment and drive our economic recovery such as:

- Additional small business grants through the NJEDA
- Workforce development funding, such as for county college training
- Investment in our innovation economy, including increasing funding for the Commission on Science, Innovation and Technology
- Infrastructure funding
- Dedicating funding to pay down outstanding debt, such as that accrued by the state's Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund
- Reducing the corporate GILTI tax to address our status as an outlier that discourages corporations from locating and/or expanding in New Jersey

Finally, we urge you to use the existing and growing budget surplus to smooth both the FY22 and FY23 budgets, rather than use the surplus all at once or not at all. After this crisis is over, we would support efforts to replenish that fund for future rainy days, which you responsibly did prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, this pandemic is the very crisis that you took the initiative to prepare the state for and, consequently, we should use those funds now when we need them most.

We urge you to consider these policies and overall themes as you work with the Legislature to enact the FY22 budget, a spending plan that will either set the stage for a historic comeback or a slow recovery.
